Resident Spotlight David Shelley, Sr.

David Shelley was born and raised on a dairy farm in northern Pennsylvania. Their farm also had timber which they used for energy. David has two brothers and one sister.

David graduated from high school in 1950 and went to work for a building material company in New York. During this time, he lived in a boarding house and enjoyed driving the flatbed truck. He was introduced to his first wife, Arleen during this time.

David enlisted in the United States Navy in 1953. He first served on the USS Sierra, a destroyer tender ship that could fix just about anything afloat. Upon his return to Norfolk, David volunteered to be a submariner. To become a submariner, one must pass psychological test to ensure that you can handle the enclosed environment, lack of sunlight, dangerous working conditions and close quarters with others for an extended time. Then you go to submarine training where submariners must learn a wide range of operational tasks and responsibilities aboard a ship, such as electrical, chemical, sonar operation, repairs, systems and operations maintenance, weaponry, navigation, cooking and supply roles. After submarine school, you receive more advanced training in handling new operational equipment, maintenance and repairs. David achieved the rank of Master Chief Petty Officer and retired from the Navy in 1973. He then joined the Holland Club, an organization for non-active duty submariners. David worked for another twenty-two years for Data Point Corporation, from which he retired in 1998 and opened an appliance repair business until his stroke in 2010.

David was married twice. David had two children with his first wife who died in 1964 from cancer. David had two young children to raise and a lady friend, Mary, who had two children of her own, agreed to help as he was often deployed or had classes to attend. They were married two years later in 1966. They had one child together. Mary, David's second wife, passed away in January of 2018. David's biggest hobby is reading.
